



Historical Information/Landmarks/ Major Attractions

Iconic landmarks and attractions abound in this vibrant city. Take in one of these sights today:

- <u>Waco Suspension Bridge:</u> Built in 1870, the Waco Suspension Bridge spans the Brazos River and played a significant role in the city's development as a transportation hub.
- <u>Dr Pepper Museum:</u> Located in downtown Waco, the Dr Pepper Museum showcases the history and cultural impact of the famous soft drink, which was invented in Waco in the late 19th century.
- <u>Texas Ranger Hall of Fame and Museum:</u> This museum pays tribute to the legendary Texas Rangers, featuring exhibits that chronicle their history, artifacts, and stories of their brave and valiant efforts.
- <u>Waco Mammoth National Monument:</u> The Waco Mammoth Site preserves the remains of a herd of Columbian mammoths discovered in 1978. Visitors can explore the excavation site and learn about the Ice Age giants.
- <u>Baylor University:</u> Established in 1845, Baylor University is the oldest continuously operating university in Texas. The campus features beautiful architecture, including the iconic Pat Neff Hall.

- McLane Stadium: Situated by the Brazos River and alongside the I-35 Corridor,
 McLane Stadium acts as both the gateway to Baylor University and a pivotal
 point for downtown Waco. This state-of-the-art multi-functional facility hosts
 world-class music, family and sporting events throughout the year in addition to
 Baylor University football. Tours are available weekly.
- <u>Mayborn Museum Complex:</u> Located on the Baylor University campus, the Mayborn Museum Complex is a family-friendly museum with interactive exhibits on natural history, science, and cultural heritage.
- <u>Historic Downtown Waco</u>: The downtown area is home to charming shops, restaurants, and historic buildings. It has experienced revitalization in recent years and offers a blend of history and contemporary attractions.
- <u>Texas Sports Hall of Fame</u>: This museum celebrates the achievements of Texas athletes and features exhibits on various sports, including football, basketball, baseball, and rodeo.
- <u>Magnolia Market at the Silos</u>: Made famous by the HGTV show "Fixer Upper," Magnolia Market is a popular shopping destination created by Chip and Joanna Gaines, offering home decor, food trucks, and a vibrant atmosphere.
- <u>Waco Tours:</u> Explore the wonders of Waco through a range of experiences, including classic tours, boat tours, or the option to tailor custom and private adventures.
- <u>Lake Waco Wetlands:</u> This is a diverse and ecologically important nature preserve located in Waco, Texas, offering visitors a peaceful and serene environment to relax, enjoy nature's beauty, engage in birdwatching, photography, and connect with the outdoors.

- <u>Balcones Distilling:</u> A renowned Waco distillery known for its exceptional handcrafted spirits. - Waco Downtown Farmers Market: Browse the local Farmers Market, which brings together local farmers, artisans, and vendors, offering a diverse array of fresh produce, handmade goods, and unique culinary delights in the heart of Waco's downtown district.



Parks and Recreation

Nestled along the Brazos River, Waco, Texas offers nature lovers a beautiful respite. These parks and recreational facilities provide a diverse range of activities and outdoor spaces for residents and visitors to enjoy without leaving the city.

- Waco Surf Park: This is one of the largest inland surfing and water sports facilities in the country, featuring an array of accommodations, a massive Cable Park, the world's allegedly longest lazy river, the Wedge Slides, and a 2-acre surf lake utilizing PerfectSwell® technology for an unparalleled surf experience, making it the perfect destination for a fun-filled day or a family adventure.

- Brazos Park East: The park features boat ramps, pavilions, a disc golf course, hiking trails, restrooms, horseshoe pits and scenic views of the limestone cliffs across the river.
- Hawaiian Falls Waterpark: With exciting water slides, lazy rivers, wave pools, and interactive play areas, Hawaiian Falls offers a fun-filled aquatic adventure for all ages. From exhilarating rides to relaxing attractions, visitors can enjoy a day of refreshing water-based entertainment and create lasting memories at this popular Waco waterpark.
- <u>Lake Waco</u>: Located just west of the city, Lake Waco is a popular destination for boating, water sports, and fishing. The lake has several parks along its shoreline, including Airport Beach Park and Reynolds Creek Park, providing facilities for swimming, picnicking, and camping.

- Waco Mammoth National Monument: In addition to its historical significance, the Waco Mammoth National Monument offers outdoor recreational opportunities. - <u>Skate park:</u> The Sul Ross Skate Park provides dedicated spaces for skateboarders and BMX riders to practice their skills.
- <u>Golf courses:</u> Golf enthusiasts can enjoy the courses in Waco, such as Cottonwood Creek Golf Course and Twin Rivers Golf Club, offering challenging fairways and beautiful surroundings. But, arguably the best golfing to be had in Central Texas can be found at <u>Ridgewood Country Club</u>.
- <u>Disc golf courses:</u> Waco has multiple disc golf courses, such as the <u>William</u>
 <u>Cameron Park</u>, <u>Dewey Park</u>, and <u>Brazos Park East</u>, where players can enjoy this popular and accessible sport.
